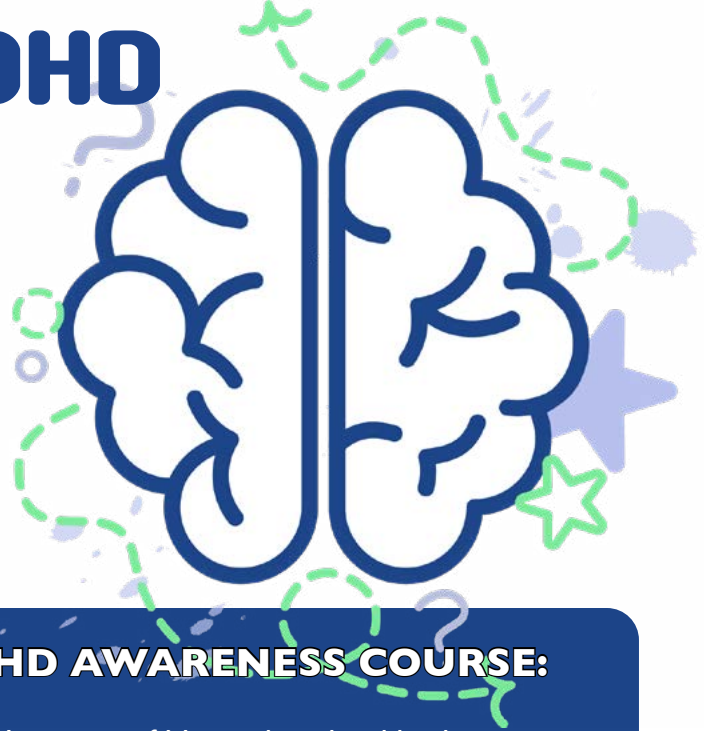


HALF-DAY WORKSHOP TO TRAIN YOUR SCHOOL ON ADHD

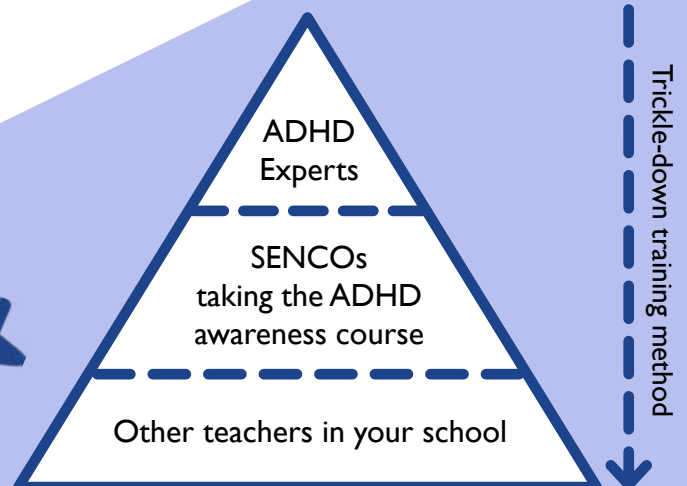


BENEFITS OF TAKING THE ADHD AWARENESS COURSE:
